AYUTLA, MEXICO: Even at late hour, volunteers greeted by mariachi band

A group of South Sound volunteers was greeted with festivities when it arrived in the small Mexican town of Ayutla late Thursday.

“Even though it was 11 p.m., they still had a crowd and mariachi band. Also a police escort into town,” Pierce County sheriff’s spokesman Ed Troyer posted on Twitter at 10:31 p.m. Thursday.

The Mission to Mexico crew stayed the night in Ayutla and spent some time with the locals Friday morning before rolling out again.

“Half the group is at the school donating dictionaries and books brought down by Ron Jarvis and Mike Henry,” Troyer posted at 9:26 a.m. Friday.

The team arrived in the town of Autlan later that afternoon. The town is the group’s final stop.

The volunteers are scheduled to fly home Sunday.
